57th Edison Science Fair

2014 marks the 57th year of the Thomas Alva Edison/Kiwanis Regional Science and Engineering Fair. This year's Science Fair will be held Saturday, January 25th at the Harborside Event Center in conjunction with the Edison Pageant of Light and the Edison Inventors Fair.

The Science and Engineering Fair includes a Junior Division, (grades 6-8) and a Senior Division, (grades 9-12). The Inventors Fair includes elementary, middle school and high school students. An estimated 700 students will participate in 400 Science Fair projects and 300 Invention projects.

For the third year, our Branch will offer a \$500 cash prize to a Lee County female student. Her project must show creativity, scientific process and positive change- such as the ability to help our community or the environment. We will present a second award to a Lee County female student who is a first-time participant.

Branch members are invited to be judges for this event. The fair is open to the public at 2:00 PM – 5:00 PM, Saturday, January 25, 2014.




