

Approximately 925 million people in the world are hungry

Melodie Turish and Russ Luther are here representing ECHO, a four-star charity honoring God through sustainable hunger solutions. Their mission is to equip people with agricultural resources and skills to reduce hunger and improve lives worldwide. ECHO empowers small-scale farmers to increase their harvests, and the nutritional diversity of their crops.

Prior to arriving at ECHO in 2013 she served as a board volunteer, non-profit founder, fundraising executive and church planting missionary. Then they returned to Pittsburgh, ministering in two different churches for 15 years.

President's Message

April 8 is Equal Pay Day. In 2013, women still earned just 77 cents, on average, for every dollar earned by their male counterparts. That number hasn't budged in the last decade, and it's about time our nation's leaders did something about it. Lilly Ledbetter refuses to accept "that's just the way it is" as a reaction/response to the gender pay gap. What about you? How will you observe Equal Pay Day? What about becoming a two-minute AAUW Activist?

It's easy and quick. Access the National AAUW website, www.aauw.org then type "two-minute activist" in the search box. Hit "search" then click on the first link listed. This brings up a page with the latest information on issues in Congress related to education, civil rights, economic security and Title IX. Each issue has suggested messages that need to be sent to our representatives. Take one more minute to personalize and e-mail a message to your member in Congress.

At this time, passage of the Paycheck Fairness Act, is most important. We need to have Senator Nelson back this bill. By just entering your zip code, you will be taken to a page that shows your representatives and provides you with an appropriate message. Type in your name and address and submit. Now how easy was that?
