Florida State Convention

The weekend of April 15 – 17, Barb Carter, Suzan Harden, Bonnie Lincoln, and Judy Sims attended the biennial AAUW FL State Convention, held this year at the Palm Beach Gardens Marriott. The theme of this year's convention was Shaping the Future: Fair Pay, Fair Play. Approximately 120 people attended.

Karen Coolman Amlong, JD, was the keynote speaker at the opening session. After being passed over for a promotion in her first job out of college because it was assumed she would get married, get pregnant, and quit, Karen began to understand the nature of workplace discrimination. She did not know what to do about it, but when she stumbled into a NOW meeting, she found her focus. She organized NOW chapters across the state of Florida. At 27 she was the first woman elected to the Florida House of Representatives from Broward County. After her first term of office, she went to law school. She won Florida's first major sexual harassment lawsuit, *Stockett v. Tolin*, in 1992. She has been a tireless advocate for ending discrimination since that time. One of the great things about her story is that her husband Bill has been her partner all along the way, including attending our convention.

Lily Ledbetter, author of *GRACE AND GRIT: MY FIGHT FOR EQUAL PAY AT GOODYEAR AND BEYOND*, was the featured speaker at Saturday's luncheon meeting. Lily's lawsuit for fair pay resulted (after a 10-year battle) in the Lily Ledbetter Fair Pay Act of 2009, the first law President Obama signed into effect. Following Lily's presentation was a panel discussion featuring Lois Frankel, US House of Representatives, Palm Beach; Lori Berman, Florida House of Representatives, Palm Beach; and Shirlyon McWhorter, Director of Equal Opportunity Programs and Diversity (including Title IX) at Florida International University. Lisa Maatz, Vice President for Government Relations at AAUW, moderated the panel discussion.

Sue Barley, national AAUW board member who is from the Greater Naples branch, brought greetings from national and made a presentation about various programs at the national level.

Lisa Maatz, outlined AAUW's legislative priorities. Lisa's career in lobbying began when, as a 3rd grader, she realized the boys' bathroom had doors but the girls' did not. She got students to sign a petition and presented it to the principal. Two weeks later the girls' bathroom had doors. She is AAUW's top lobbyist and is a sought-after speaker, political strategist and activist.



Our branch received a certificate for increasing our membership. Two of our members, Naomi Bloom and Marie Shively, received ribbons as a "Friend of AAUW" for their contributions to the AAUW Fund.

As usual, the basket raffle was a highlight of the convention. Our thanks go to Janet George and Bonnie Ryan for putting together our branch's contribution, called Salute To Earthly Magic (STEM). It was a beautiful basket anchored with a garden stool and including garden tools and books. Thank you so much!

The next state convention will be in 2018. Let's take a strong delegation!

AAUW Ft Myers/Lee Co Branch Scholarship Committee Report – April 2016

It's been a busy year for the Scholarship. We made changes to our criteria for our endowed scholarships and we set 5 year goals for the endowments.

Sue Gottcent Scholarship: We had 4 reviewers for our applications for a scholarship recipient for the Sue Gottcent award, Janet, Bonnie, Ellen and Marie. Melanie Halloway, SWFL Community Foundation liaison says that there are several other people reviewing our applicants and their ratings will be combined with ours to make a recommendation to the board. The IRS rules for foundations require that the donors cannot be the only voice in making a recommendation. The board will make the decision in May. Melanie states that her voice is important as well. She agreed with our position that although 3 of the 5 applicants were impressive, one appeared to have little need; one had extremely broad goals but a lower grade point. The applicant that 5 of us hope will be selected finally is a single mother, has already earned a BS degree in nursing and is working to become a Nurse Anesthetist. She has experienced family illness and tragedy and been able to help her family while keeping her grades up. One reader wrote "Outstanding candidate with proven record of succeeding in spite of hardships." The Foundation requests that we not reveal her name until they do so.

Star Bright Scholarship: During a busy Christmas season, we reviewed applications for the Star Bright Scholarship and awarded a \$1,000 grant to Kelly P. Gequelin, an Architectural Drafting student at FMTC, Fort Myers Technical College. The receipts for the Star Bright donations are up to date with \$405 for the memorial award.

Tech Trek: Janet and Colleen beat the bushes for recommendations for Tech Trek and we had 14 rising eighth grade girls nominated by their teachers. Eight applied. We reviewed the recommendations and interviewed the girls and a parent of each. Four of the applicants were selected by Tech Trek State committee. They are: Melanie Pena, Challenger, Sarah Laboda, Cypress Lakes, Brooke Turner, Varsity Lakes, and Morgan Russell, Caloosa. Attached to this report is a list of suggestions that will be submitted to the Tech Trek State committee. It has been our recommendation that we not go forward with the High School Scholarship this year but instead consider using those moneys to fund the Tech Trek students. The board wanted to wait upon that decision until we knew how many girls from Lee County would be attending. We will need to decide soon whether we will conduct a campaign to solicit funds for Tech Trek 17 from Corporate Donors in our area.

FSW Scholarship: Ellen and Judy attended the President's Luncheon at FSW where they met our recipient for next year, lovely, Ashley Shilling a Video Production student who will be entering the Film Festival at the Sidney and Berne Davis Center. We look forward to knowing more about Ashley.

FGCU Scholarship: Suzan, Marie and Judy attended the FGCU Foundations Luncheon at the Hyatt Regency where they met our scholarship recipient, Andrea Bruno, a lovely, confident young woman, a single mother graduating in June.

Suggestions for Tech Trek

Direct Branches to select a Tech Trek Coordinator by June and communicate about the finances and need to raise monies for the next year so Branches can include it in their budgeting.

Shirley Reid's letter explaining how students are selected should be sent also. It was excellent.

Copy all branch Tech Trek Coordinators and Presidents on the booklet produced following Tech Trek 2016 by September. Information should include # of Branches participated and # of students attended camp, dollars each donated and contributed from fundraiser.

Direct all Tech Trek Coordinators to view all information on the Web regarding Tech Trek.

Copy each Branch on the current year and past year finances, donations and expenses.

Host a teleconference with all Coordinators in early October.

In order to not duplicate an appeal to a corporation, a method of reporting which corporations have donated and which branch solicited the donation should be implemented. We are imagining both our Branch and the Naples Branch approaching Hertz. We don't want to lose the goodwill of corporate donors by having multiple solicitations.

Suggestions for Tech Trek continued.

We need to clarify whether corporate donors can be assured that they are sending local girls to the state Tech Trek camp.

The managing of fund raising for Tech Trek FL needs to be transparent. Branches that are 501(c)(3) cannot submit funds to Tech Trek Florida or AAUW Florida as they are not listed on the FL database as authorized to solicit donations. Corporate donors would want to know to what 501(c)(3) they are donating. Request each Branch submit a plan for raising Tech Trek Funds.

Ask each Branch Tech Trek Coordinator to share the manner they were able to successfully get Tech Trek information to 7th grade Math and Science teachers.

The rating scale for judging the nomination, essay and application should be refined so that diversity and no previous opportunities adds points as well as the ability of the student to articulate STEM interest during the interview.

A 3 point rating scale is not discriminating enough. A 5 point scale would be better or even a 10.

Each Branch Coordinator should call the parent/parents following the student's nomination. (Many parents had no idea what AAUW was and had many questions about the process and the camp. The Coordinator should give them their telephone number so parents can call if more questions arise.)

Branch Coordinators should contact each selected student/parent following notification to offer congratulations and suggest a meeting so girls/parents can get acquainted.

If possible, teachers of selected nominees should be contacted by email and congratulated and thanked for their support of Tech Trek. This might stimulate classroom discussion of the camp and create future student interest.

Principals and the teachers that have had students attend Tech Trek should be recognized by AAUW following the camp. This would help keep them more informed about the camp and cultivate their continued support and promotion of Tech Trek. Maybe send them a camp booklet?

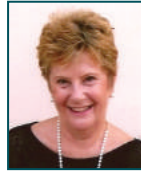
