January Speakers:


Our January AAUW meeting will have a presentation by Authors Robin Tuthill and Tom Hall.

Robin and Tom co-authored "Female Pioneers of Fort Myers". They will give us examples and legacies of our town's outstanding early women leaders. Their book is the rich personal stories of twenty-four exceptional women who suffered and overcame rigorous hardships, incomprehensible loss and numbing tragedies. Their lives impacted the development of the town's culture, building and amenities from 1866 through the 1900s. Through riveting stories of success against the odds, Female Pioneers of Fort Myers brings to the forefront the everyday female leaders who helped transform

Fort Myers from a rough-and-tumble cow town into a modern-day city.

Robin was born and raised in St. Petersburg, Florida, into a family that spent weekends boating and fishing the waters of Tampa Bay and the Gulf of Mexico. She holds a bachelor's degree in English from Purdue University and two masters' degrees from the University of South Florida. Robin lives in North Fort Myers.

Thomas P. Hall is an art journalist, arts advocate and local historian. He is founder and editor of Art Southwest Florida, a free one-stop art destination website. He holds bachelor's, master's and juris doctorate degrees from the University of Florida. Originally from New Jersey, Tom has made Florida his home for more than 45 years
