The AAUW National Board of Directors has voted to put three proposals for bylaws amendments before the membership for a vote this spring. The board strongly supports the proposed amendments that we believe will help keep AAUW vital as an organization and enable us to increase our impact in advancing equity for women and girls.

The proposed amendments address creating three-year staggered board terms, opening board service to those outside of the AAUW membership, and eliminating the degree requirement for membership. While rationale and details for each proposed amendment can be found on the <u>AAUW website</u>, the overarching motivation for these changes at this time is to uphold and advance AAUW's mission and ensure optimal execution at the national board level.

The first two proposals would bring AAUW's board governance structure more in line with nationally accepted nonprofit best practices and the needs of the organization.

The third proposal — to eliminate the degree requirement for membership — has come before the membership for vote a number of times. The board feels strongly that while the degree requirement made perfect sense at AAUW's inception, this requirement is now perceived by many as counter to our mission and limits our ability to build the capacity needed to increase our impact as an organization.

The board recognizes that we have not traditionally put proposals up for vote outside our AAUW National Election, but these proposed changes have been under consideration for several years by both the Governance Committee and the board, and we believe it is important to move forward without delay to position the organization for greater growth.

Members can comment on the proposed amendments

and submit their own proposals from February 22, 2018, through March 22, 2018, at 11:59 p.m. ET. Voting will open on April 25, 2018, and close June 9, 2018, at 9 p.m. ET.

We encourage you all to engage in respectful debate that has always been a hallmark of the AAUW community, exercise your vote, and encourage fellow members to do the same.

#### Oh No, Dues Increase

It's true! The National Board has voted to raise dues by \$10. The good news is that State will not raise dues. Our Branch dues will remain \$9.00 a year and have not been increased since 1995. Renewal will be \$80. We will also have the drawing for a "free lunch" from the names of those who have paid their dues by the May meeting. You do not have to attend to win.

More good news, National will continue the "Shape The Future," an incentive program for new members by which any new member or member who hasn't been a member of National for two years will have reduced National and State Dues. Those dues are \$45. For each 2 Shape The Future members, our Branch is given a credit for a

member's National dues. So this is an incentive for the new members and an incentive for the Branch to recruit. AAUW has been shaping the future for women since 1882 and has supported every women's rights issue with legislation, philanthropy and research. Fifteen or so years ago, they financed the research showing that young girls were as interested in and as good at math and science as boys until middle school. AAUW began the push for STEM programs. Now their focus is getting more women to run for office and equal pay for women in the work force.

Gretchen Elizabeth Carlson is an American television commentator and author and the chairwoman of the Miss America board of directors. Carlson was crowned the 1989 Miss America while representing her native state of Minnesota. She graduated from Stanford University with honors before embarking on a career in television. She joined CBS News as a correspondent in 2000 and became the co-host of the Saturday edition of The Early Show. In 2005, she moved to Fox News Channel, and became the co-host of the morning show Fox & Friends. In 2013, she announced her departure from Fox & Friends and soon thereafter launched a new program called "The Real Story with Gretchen Carlson." Her autobiography, Getting Real, was published in 2015 by Viking. In her new book, Be Fierce: Stop Harassment and Take Your Power the former Fox News Back. anchor Gretchen Carlson examines the prevalence of sexual harassment and different to combat it.
