On the Topic of Everglades Restoration, Our Speaker for March will be Dr. William Mitsch

Dr. William Mitsch's topic will be "Everglades Restoration, Florida Waterways and our Environment --What needs to be done right now."

Dr. Mitsch is currently Eminent Scholar and Director, Everglades Wetland Research Park, at Florida Gulf Coast University, Naples, Florida. His research and teaching has focused on wetland biogeochemistry, wetland creation and restoration, ecological engineering, and ecosystem modeling. The U.S. Congress formally authorized the Comprehensive Everglades Restoration Plan (CERP) in 2000 as a multi-decadal, multibillion-dollar project focused on restoring, preserving and protecting the south Florida ecosystem while providing for other water-related needs of the region.

One of the primary goals has always been to "send the water south" in an attempt to restore the original hydrology of the region by diverting less water from the upper watershed east and west to the sea and allowing it to flow south to and through the Everglades. "These created or restored wetlands have been effective in significantly reducing phosphorus concentrations before the water is discharged to the Everglades," according to Dr. Mitsch.
