

Our November Speaker is Dr. Steven L. Derfler...

Dr. Derfler is an international educational consultant, public speaker, archaeologist, historian, researcher, teacher and writer; Dr. Derfler has been uncovering the histories of Ancient Civilizations for 45 years. Tracing the development of western religions from their roots in the Middle East and Eastern Mediterranean countries, Dr. Derfler brings insight to current political and social events, bridging the past with the future to promote greater understanding between people from different faiths and walks of life. He will speak on one of the greatest archaeological discoveries and subsequent mysteries of the 20th century, that emerged on Nov. 26, 1922, when Howard Carter identified the tomb of the boy-king Tutankhamen. Over the next few years, over 5000 objects were removed, along with his intact sarcophagus and entombed mummy. Of the 62 tombs discovered in "The Canyon," as Carter called the Valley of the Kings, it was the only royal tomb found fully intact.

1. AAUW FGCU Endowed Scholarship

Alyssa Crowbridge, Elementary Education

History:

Established in 2000 with member and state matching funds to create \$10,000 endowment.



Goal: Add to the fund \$3,000

per year for next 5 years to reach a five-year goal of \$52,000 to sustain an annual \$2,000 scholarship. Currently awards \$1,500.

Scholarship Criteria: FGCU female student from the Lee, Collier, Charlotte, Glades or Hendry county area, with financial need pursuing an undergraduate degree.

2. AAUW Sue Gottcent Memorial



Larissa Browne,

Master of Social Work

History: Established in 2006 with a \$52,000 bequest from the estate of member Sue Gottcent, an avid supporter of AAUW's mission. Currently awards \$2,000.

Goal: Yearly \$2,000 scholarship.

Scholarship Criteria: Female student age 25 or older, Lee County Resident, with financial need and attends an institute of higher learning that is part of the Florida State University system. Priority will be given to a current awardee for subsequent years.

3. AAUW FSW State College Endowed Scholarship



Anissa Avalos Psych Major **History:** The Branch granted many awards to female students through the years. In 2005 an endowed scholarship was established with \$5,000 raised by the members and matched by the state.

Goal: Add to the fund \$1,500 each

year for the next five years to achieve a \$40,000 principle to sustain a \$1,500 annual award. Currently awards \$1,000.

Scholarship Criteria: Female Lee County student with financial need attending the Fort Myers Campus of FSW. Priority is given to a current awardee based on completion and submission of successful coursework grades.

4. Scholarship: AAUW Star Bright Scholarship



Krystal Davis Medical Scholarship History: AAUW members of Book Club 3 established the "Star-Bright Memorial Fund" in 2005. Our members make donations honoring friends and commemorating special events. As funds accrue, awards are made to women for college or

vocational education.

Goal: Awarded as \$1,000 is accrued.

Scholarship Criteria: Female student attending Second Semester at Fort Myers Technical College or Cape Coral Technical College who maintains Satisfactory Academic Progress in attendance and technical skill.
