WOW, what a time this has been for all of us!! And now we need your help. Unfortunately, one of the consequences of COVID-19 is that our major, in-person, fund-raising event, the Fashion Show, has been cancelled. Despite this, we remain committed to our primary focus "empowering women and girls" through our scholarships. We are hopeful that, with your help, we will be able to award all of our scholarships.

Many of you have attended the luncheons honoring our scholarship recipients and been moved by their stories and the gratitude they feel for our demonstrated confidence in them. Please help us support the development of future women leaders. Three scholarships are particularly in jeopardy this year:

1. AAUW Lee County High School Scholarship: Established in 2011 in memory of Jane Wagner, a two-term branch president. It awards one \$1,000 scholarship per year to a graduating female student with financial need and few other scholarships selected by the school counselor. The award is paid to the college of the recipient's choice.

The other two scholarships in jeopardy are both STEM focused and support women studying science, technology, engineering, and math. As our website describes:

"In an era when women are increasingly prominent in medicine, law, and business, why are there so few women scientists and engineers? A 2010 research report by AAUW presents compelling evidence that can help to explain this puzzle. Eight key research findings point to environmental and social barriers — including stereotypes, gender bias, and the climate of science and engineering departments in colleges and universities — that continue to block women's progress in STEM. AAUW Fort Myers/Lee County members believe that the best way to break down environmental and social barriers is to get girls interested and involved in science and engineering early. To accomplish this, we support the following programs for girls at the middle and high school levels."

- 2. AAUW STEM Award: Established in 2001 to encourage middle and high school girls in STEM fields. It awards one \$500 prize to a top female entrant in the Thomas Alva Edison & Kiwanis Regional Science and Engineering Fair. A "First Time" award of \$100 is also given to a female entrant for an outstanding first entry. All Lee County female high school entrants in the Edison Regional Science Fair are eligible.
- **3.** *Girls in Engineering, Math and Science (GEMS):* This program is dedicated to middle school girls. The program is offered four times a year at the Whitaker Center for STEM education at FGCU. The female faculty members mentor FGCU female STEM majors who in turn mentor middle school girls through four Saturday events over each year reaching 400 middle-school girls. Our goal is to award \$1000 to this program annually.

What can you do to help? Did you know that our branch receives only \$9 of your annual dues? This means that we need all of our members' help to continue to offer our scholarships. Please consider making a donation to our scholarship fund. Woman of Interest



Akiko Iwasaki is the Waldemar Von Zedtwitz Professor in the Department of Immunobiology and a Professor in the Department of Molecular, Cellular, and Developmental Biology at Yale University. Until this year, Akiko Iwasaki had never had tubes of human blood delivered to her lab. "We were mostly working with mouse models," savs the immunologist. "We used to look at the data and contemplate it." Then COVID-19 struck. In a matter of weeks, Iwasaki overhauled her research to launch a slew of studies on how the new virus, SARS-CoV-2, (COVID-19 takes its toll on patients. She and her nearly two dozen lab members know their discoveries could impact people falling sick right now.

"Every minute counts." In the months since, she has produced a string of high-profile papers in which she has redirected her expertise in the immune system to questions such as why men are more likely than women to fare poorly if infected and how immune responses in hospitalized patients can help predict their prognosis. Now, she is turning her attention to long-haulers, people who suffer a bout with the virus and don't fully recover.
