OUR SCHOLARSHIPS IN THE TIME OF COVID: PLEASE HELP US HELP OTHERS

Thank you to all who have already sent in your contributions. If you are thinking of making a first or second contribution, it would be greatly appreciated. As you know, one of the consequences of COVID is that our major, in-person, fund-raising event, the Fashion Show, has been cancelled. Despite this, we remain committed to our primary focus "empowering women and girls" through our scholarships. We are hopeful that, with your help, we will be able to award all of our scholarships this year.

Many of you have attended the luncheons honoring our scholarship recipients and been moved by their stories and the gratitude they feel for our demonstrated confidence in their future success. So, we are asking you, on behalf of our potential future honorees, to please help us continue to support the growth and development of future women leaders.

Three scholarships are particularly in jeopardy this year.

1. AAUW Lee County High School Scholarship: Established in 2011 in memory of Jane Wagner, a two-term branch president. It awards one \$1,000 scholarship per year to a graduating female student with financial need and with few other scholarships chosen by the school counselor. The award is paid to the college of the recipient's choice.

The other two scholarships in jeopardy are both STEM focused and support women studying science, technology, engineering, and math. As our website describes:

"In an era when women are increasingly prominent in medicine, law, and business, why are there so few women scientists and engineers? A 2010 research report by AAUW presents compelling evidence that can help to explain this puzzle. Eight key research findings point to environmental and social barriers — including stereotypes, gender bias, and the climate of science and engineering departments in colleges and universities — that continue to block women's progress in STEM.

AAUW Fort Myers/Lee County members believe that the best way to break down environmental and social barriers is to get girls interested and involved in science and engineering early. To accomplish this, we support the following programs for girls at the middle and high school levels."

2. AAUW STEM Award: Established in 2001 to encourage middle and high school girls in STEM fields. It awards one \$500 prize to a top female entrant in the Thomas Alva Edison & Kiwanis Regional Science and Engineering Fair. A "First Time" award of \$100 is also given to a female entrant for an outstanding first entry. All Lee County female high school entrants in the Edison Regional Science Fair are eligible.

3. Girls in Engineering, Math and Science (GEMS):

This hands-on program is dedicated to science education for regional middle school girls by enthusiastic professionals and undergraduates as facilitators and role models in a girls-only environment. The program is offered to middle school girls four times a year at the Whitaker Center for STEM education at FGCU. The female faculty members mentor FGCU female STEM majors who in turn mentor middle school girls through four Saturday events over each year reaching 400 middle-school girls. Our goal is to award \$1000 to this program annually.

Dr. Mae C Jemison was born in 1956 in Decatur, Alabama. She received a Bachelor in Chemical Engineering (and completed the requirements for a Bachelor in African and Afro-American studies) at Stanford University in 1977, and also received a Doctorate degree in medicine from Cornell University.



After medical school she did post-graduate medical training and worked as an area Peace Corps medical officer for Sierra Leone and Liberia, managing the health care delivery system for US Peace Corps and US Embassy personnel. Jemison's background includes work in the areas of nuclear magnetic resonance spectroscopy, and reproductive biology. She also developed and participated in research projects on the

WHAT HAVE YOU BEEN DOING WHILE SHELTERING AT HOME?

Sewing, knitting, baking, crafting, art projects or other creative activities?

If so, we all could work on something to raise funds for our scholarships.

We have three ways you can use your time to help out.

- 1. Creative crafts can be part of the silent auction at a future fashion show. If we are still unable to get together in large groups, we may have an online auction. Stores are giving wild discounts to attract customers. Pick up something to save for the auction.
- 2. Donations can be made in honor of or in memory of someone special. Sizable donations will be commemorated in the TORCH with a note written by the donor of up to 25 words; or a photo can be included with a caption of up to 10 words. Be thinking of who you would like to honor.
- 3. We have been spending time at home and cooking more. AAUW (our chapter) is planning to compile a cookbook. Choose some of your favorite tested recipes and send them to peggycihi@comcast.net. Include your name, title and category of the recipe, ingredients and instructions. Here is a recipe submitted for the cookbook:

Potato Salad

Ingredients

- 8 small potatoes
- 4 -5 hard boiled eggs
- ½-1 cup mayonnaise (or enough to make ingredients nicely moist)
- 1 tsp sugar
- 1 tsp vinegar
- Sprinkle of celery seed (generous)
- Sprinkle of minced onion (fresh or from spice rack)
- Sprinkle of paprika

Instructions

- 1. Place the whole, unpeeled potatoes in a large pot of water. Bring the water to a boil, then lower the heat and simmer for 15 20 minutes, until the potatoes are fork tender.
- 2. Hard boil the eggs.
- 3. Drain the water from the pots and then spray cold water on potatoes and eggs to cool. Place drained potatoes and eggs in the refrigerator to cool completely.
- 4. Peel potatoes, if desired, (I don't peel them because so many vitamins are in the skin) and cut them into bite-size pieces. Peel the eggs.
- 5. Mix the sliced potatoes with the mayonnaise, vinegar, sugar, onion and celery seed.
- 6. Slice the eggs. Add all, except one of the sliced eggs. Save the last egg for garnish on top.
- 7. Fold the eggs into the potato mixture.
- 8. Add last sliced egg on top and sprinkle with paprika.
- 9. Cover and refrigerate to allow the flavors to blend.
