

MEET STEPHANIE MATHEWS

One day, while on a routine doctor's appointment, our member, Judith Sims, noticed a



name on the front of a nearby door: *Stephanie Mathews*. The name seemed familiar, but Judith wasn't sure where she knew it from.

Stephanie Mathews, it turns out, was the name

of one of our chapter's scholarship recipients. In fact, she was the very first one who received a scholarship from the Fort Myers/Lee County branch. Twenty years have passed since Stephanie was in college. As of today, she has earned numerous degrees and certifications, among them: B.S in Nursing from Florida Gulf Coast University; two Masters degrees, one in Health Management, the other in Nursing; and a Doctorate in Nursing Practice from the University of South Florida.

She is also an AAPRN, an autonomous nurse practitioner. What is amazing to anyone hearing about Stephanie is that she obtained all this education while working and raising a daughter. She recounts how twenty years ago, almost no support was available for working mothers with children. Now, The American Family Leave Act allows women to take maternity leave, but it is really a misnomer. The woman must use up all her sick leave first, then she takes leave, but has no income. The main protection is against being let go for taking maternity leave. Lack of pay equity in a maledominated field such as medicine is still a huge issue. Despite these obstacles, Stephanie Mathews has reached her goals. She owns her own practice, Brashear Geriatrics and contracts with skilled nursing and rehabilitation centers. As if that were not enough, Stephanie also teaches as an adjunct profession in the Graduate Nursing Department at USF!

"Receiving scholarships, including the one from AAUW, allowed me to accomplish my academic and professional goals and care for my daughter to the best of my ability. It has helped me become a better woman. I am forever grateful for the generosity of AAUW, as it has shaped who I have become. Thank you for taking a chance on me. It changed my life."

In our April meeting, we will have a chance to see and hear from Stephanie again. We would like to honor her with a certificate of appreciation and a year's free membership in AAUW. She is the reason we have a mission to help women and girls obtain their educational goals. What better example could we have than Stephanie Mathews?

Our members continue to step up and as members of our Lee AAUW community, I think we would all agree that the things we do together, from the book clubs to the fashion show, are fun. We would undoubtedly also agree that we learn a lot from our luncheon speakers and from our Great Decisions discussions, and that we can't wait to be able to get back together in person. In the meantime, it is clear from your generosity that you haven't lost sight of our primary focus: "empowering women and girls" through our scholarships. THANK YOU for your generous support!!!!

This month we received an additional \$1,300 from Peggy Cihi, Kathleen Haibach, Jill Jennings, Mary Jane McDowell and Judith Sims. This brings our total scholarship donations to \$4,300 with an additional \$650 in unrestricted funds. To all those who have contributed, THANK YOU for helping us help girls and women achieve their potential!!

We awarded two STEM scholarships this month. These scholarships were established in 2001 to encourage middle and high school girls in STEM fields. The first award is \$500 to a top female entrant in the Thomas Alva Edison & Kiwanis Regional Science and Engineering Fair. This year it was awarded to Kalyn Stetina a junior at Lehigh Senior High School. Her project is "HOW IS SOYBEAN AND VULCAN LETTUCE PLANT GROWTH AFFECTED WHEN WATERED WITH DILUTIONS OF GREYWATER CONTAINING DIFFERENT DISH DETERGENTS?" The second scholarship is a "First Time" award of \$100 given to a female entrant for an outstanding first entry. This was awarded to Kiki Jiang a sophomore at Bonita Springs High School. Her project is "THE EFFECT OF DIFFERENT TYPES OF LIGHTING ON ACRYLIC PAINT."

Reviewing the entries was a wonderful experience.. We were all so impressed by the sophistication of the projects. I have to admit that your Scholarship Committee was not even able to understand some of the titles! Thankfully we had the expertise and guidance of Cathy Tucker, a science teacher at Fort Myers High School and a member of our Lee AAUW community. We cannot thank her enough for all her work and patience.

If you have not had the opportunity to donate, it is not too late. As you all know, because of Covid, this is our only fund-raising mechanism, so we REALLY need your contributions, so we can support more girls and women.

OUR SCHOLARSHIPS:

AAUW Star Bright Scholarship: This scholarship was established in 2005, by Book Club 3, to provide branch members with the opportunity to make donations honoring friends and commemorating special events. As funds accrue, a \$1,000 scholarship is awarded to a female student attending the second semester at Fort Myers or Cape Coral Technical College.

AAUW Lee County High School Scholarship: Established in 2011 in memory of Jane Wagner, a three-term branch president. It awards one \$1,000 scholarship per year to a graduating female student with financial need and few other scholarships chosen by the school counselor. The award is paid to the college of the recipient's choice.

AAUW STEM Award: Established in 2001 to encourage middle and high school girls in STEM fields. It awards one \$500 prize to a top female entrant in the Thomas Alva Edison & Kiwanis Regional Science and Engineering Fair. A "First Time" award of \$100 is also given to a female entrant for an outstanding first entry. All Lee County female high school entrants in the Edison Regional Science Fair are eligible.

Marie Glasgow and AAUW STEM Award Fund: Established in 2019 in honor of Marie Glasgow, president of AAUW Fort Myers/Lee Co Branch for two years. It is awarded each year with the goal of improving educational opportunities by rewarding young Middle School girl(s) who are winners at the Junior Division of Edison-Kiwanis Science Fair or Thomas Edison Festival of Light Regional Inventors Fair.

Girls in Engineering, Math and Science (GEMS): This hands-on program is dedicated to science education for regional enthusiastic middle school girls bv undergraduates professionals and as facilitators and role models in a girls-only environment.

AAUW FGCU Endowed Scholarship: Established in 2000, with member and matching funds from the state, it awards one scholarship to a female student who resides in the five-county (Lee, Collier, Charlotte, Glades, Hendry) area with financial need pursuing an undergraduate degree at FGCU. Priority is given to the current awardee.

AAUW Sue Gottcent Memorial Endowed Scholarship: Established in 2006 with a bequest from the estate of member Sue Gottcent who was an avid supporter of AAUW's mission. It awards one \$2,000 scholarship to a Lee County female student age 25 or older with demonstrated financial need who attends an institute of higher education that is part of the Florida State University system. Priority us given to the current awardee.

AAUW FSW State College Endowed Scholarship: Established in 2000, with member and matching funds from the state, it awards one \$1,000 scholarship to a female Lee County student with financial need attending the Fort Myers Campus of FSW. Priority is given to the current awardee.


Woman of Interest

Dr. Kizzmekia Corbet

Dr. Kizzmekia S. Corbett is a research fellow and the



scientific lead for the Coronavirus Vaccines & Immunopathogenesis Team at the National Institutes of Health (NIH). She was and still is one of the leading scientists behind the government's search for a vaccine. Corbett is part of a team at NIH that worked with

Moderna, the pharmaceutical company that developed one of the two *mRNA* vaccines that has shown to be more than 90% effective. She earned a PhD in microbiology and immunology from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (UNC-Chapel Hill) in 2014.^[4]Appointed to the Vaccine Research Center in 2014, she is currently the scientific lead of the VRC's Coronavirus Team,^[5] with research efforts aimed at propelling novel coronavirus vaccines, includina a COVID-19 vaccine.^{[6][7]} In December 2020, the Institute's Director, Dr. Anthony Fauci said: "Kizzy is an African American scientist who is right at the forefront of the development of the vaccine."


Chicken Salad with Grapes
