Women of Interest: AAUW winners of the STEM Award*

STEM

December 4 - 10 is Computer Science Education Week

Science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) is a broad term used to group together these academic disciplines. This term is typically used to address an education policy or curriculum choices in schools. It has implications for workforce development, national security concerns (as a shortage of STEM-educated citizens can reduce effectiveness in this area) and immigration policy. The *science* in STEM typically refers to two or more of three major branches of science:

- 1. formal sciences, of which mathematics is an example, along with logic and statistics and computer science
- 2. natural sciences, including biology, physics, and chemistry;
- 3. social sciences such as: psychology, sociology, and political science.

Organizations in the United States, such as the National Science Foundation; the Department of Labor's online database for job seekers in STEM, O*Net; and the Department of Homeland Security use all three.

Our branch of AAUW supports STEM education in our schools in Lee County.



Directions to Picnic Point in The Landings

Our Scholarships:

A special thank you to Naomi Bloom for her generous gift to the *AAUW Star Bright Scholarship* in memory of her husband, Ron Wallace. Her gift enables us to continue empowering women and girls through our scholarships.

AAUW Star Bright Scholarship: This scholarship was established in 2005, by Book Club 3, to provide branch members with the opportunity to make donations honoring friends and commemorating special events. As funds accrue, a \$1,000 scholarship is awarded to a female student attending the second semester at Fort Myers or Cape Coral Technical College.

AAUW Lee County High School Scholarship: Established in 2011 in memory of Jane Wagner, a three-term branch president. It awards one \$1,000 scholarship per year to a graduating female student with financial need and few other scholarships chosen by the school counselor. The award is paid to the college of the recipient's choice.

AAUW STEM Award: Established in 2001 to encourage middle and high school girls in STEM fields. It awards one \$500 prize to a top female entrant in the Thomas Alva Edison & Kiwanis Regional Science and Engineering Fair. A "First Time" award of \$100 is also given to a female entrant for an outstanding first entry. All Lee County female high school entrants in the Edison Regional Science Fair are eligible.

EMPOWERING WOMEN AND GIRLS: OUR SCHOLARSHIPS

Marie Glasgow and AAUW STEM Award Fund: Established in 2019 in honor of Marie Glasgow, president of AAUW Fort Myers/Lee Co Branch for two years. It is awarded each year with the goal of improving educational opportunities by rewarding young Middle School girl(s) who are winners at the Junior Division of Edison-Kiwanis Science Fair or Thomas Edison Festival of Light Regional Inventors Fair.

Girls in Engineering, Math and Science (GEMS): This hands-on program is dedicated to science education for regional middle school girls by enthusiastic professionals and undergraduates as facilitators and role models in a girls-only environment.

AAUW FGCU Endowed Scholarship: Established in 2000, with member and matching funds from the state, it awards one scholarship to a female student who resides in the five-county (Lee, Collier, Charlotte, Glades, Hendry) area with financial need pursuing an undergraduate degree at FGCU. Priority is given to the current awardee.

AAUW Sue Gottcent Memorial Endowed Scholarship: Established in 2006 with a bequest from the estate of member Sue Gottcent who was an avid supporter of AAUW's mission. It awards one \$2,000 scholarship to a Lee County female student age 25 or older with demonstrated financial need who attends an institute of higher education that is part of the Florida State University system. Priority is given to the current awardee.

AAUW FSW State College Endowed Scholarship: Established in 2000, with member and matching funds from the state, it awards one \$1,000 scholarship to a female Lee County student with financial need attending the Fort Myers Campus of FSW. Priority is given to the current awardee.

PUBLIC POLICY

An important part of AAUW's mission is to inform members of public policy issues, debates, and decisions that affect the lives of women throughout their lifespans and to actively engage with legislators to provide information as issues arise. The following statement taken directly from the AAUW national website explains AAUW's philosophy of advocacy succinctly:

"Though we are non-partisan, we are not values-neutral: We fight to remove the barriers and biases that stand in the way of gender equity. We train women to negotiate for pay and benefits and to pursue leadership roles. And we advocate for federal, state and local laws and policies to ensure equity and end discrimination."

The AAUW FL Board and the Public Policy Committee are preparing for Lobby Days, which will be held January 18 and 19, 2022. Lobby Days will be virtual again this year, and all AAUW FL members are invited to participate. There is no cost but your time. The agenda is being finalized but will include a review of the bills related to AAUW's mission which AAUW FL is supporting or opposing, strategies for advocating and working with legislators, and virtual conversations with legislators who initiated bills we determined are most closely related to our mission. Usually, of the dozens of bills that are submitted by legislators for consideration each session, we narrow it down to five or so bills for action by AAUW FL members. Here is an overview of the process of preparing for Lobby Days.

The first step is to review the AAUW Public Policy Priorities for this biennium. Last spring AAUW's members voted to accept the following priorities for the 2021-2023 biennium by a 92 percent vote:

- 1) To support a strong system of public education that promotes gender fairness, equity, diversity and inclusivity, and addresses the barriers and implicit biases that hinder the advancement of women and girls.
- 2) To achieve economic security for all women, including equity and fairness in compensation and benefits, enforcement of employment discrimination statutes, a closing of the gender and race gaps in leadership opportunities, the strengthening of retirement benefits and programs.
- 3) To guarantee equality, individual rights, and social justice for a diverse and inclusive society.

The AAUW FL Board is reviewing the bills submitted for consideration by legislators. Bills closely relating to our mission are identified. The bills identified as critical may change, as legislators have until the 2022 Session begins January 11 to submit bills for consideration.

After the AAUW FL Board identifies the bills to be considered for our efforts, they are referred to the national AAUW Board for review and approval. We can submit a bill for approval after National makes its initial review if we believe it is necessary to do so.

Once the list is finalized, those of us on the AAUW FL Public Policy Committee divide the bills to research and prepare talking points. The talking points are submitted to the AAUW FL Board for approval. The talking points will be reviewed during Lobby Days and are made available to members to use for their individual advocacy efforts.

Individual branches are encouraged to meet either virtually or in person with local legislators to secure passage or opposition of the identified bills.

In the January Torch, the bills to be discussed during Lobby Days will be shared. To see the bills that have been proposed so far, you can go to www.myfloridahouse.gov. Click on "Bills" to see a list. To follow particular bills, click on "Tracking" to enter your personal information for e-mail updates.
