# AAUW Speaker for September: Jemetta Hunt What You Can Do To Improve Your Balance And Prevent Falls

Our September 17th luncheon meeting will feature Jemetta Hunt (right), Past President and current Vice President for Membership of our own AAUW. Originally from Indiana, Jemetta earned a B.A from Purdue University in Health and Physical Education and an M.Ed. in Urban Education Administration from the University of Massachusetts.

After a career in education, both as a licensed Physical Education and Health teacher, and later as a School Administrator, Jemetta retired in 1995, and launched a new career as a fitness instructor, personal trainer and coach, which she has enjoyed for over 25 years. Currently she holds a staggering number of certifications, including Tai Chi for Arthritis and Fall Prevention; Buff Bones; Longevity Wellness; Holistic Fitness; and Balance Progression Training, to name just a few. She is currently teaching several classes at *ELLIO* here in Fort Myers.



Jemetta's presentation will focus on problems often faced by retirees. Some facts to make you sit up and take note: One of every two people aged 65 or older falls each year. Of five falls, one of them will cause a serious injury such as a broken bone. Some 32,000 people will die from a fall each year. Jemetta will show us some balance exercises from Chinese Tai Chi, gentle warm- up exercises done on a chair or standing, and other strategies to literally keep us on or feet and prevent falling. This is one meeting you'll want to attend for your health and fitness!

#### Woman of Interest: Rebecca Latimer Felton

Rebecca Latimer Felton lived a life that was as full as it was long. A writer and tireless campaigner for Progressive Era reforms, especially women's rights, she was the first woman to serve in the U.S. Senate.

A Suffragette and activist in the early twentieth century, Felton embraced the reform with which she is most associated: **Women's Suffrage**. She became the South's best known and most effective champion of women's right to vote.



Rebecca Felton was appointed the first woman U.S. Senator at 87-years-old, but she served for only two days.

Rebecca Felton was a complex figure: in some ways she was very progressive, an exceptional Georgian; in other ways, she was very much a person of her time and place. She died on January 24, 1930 at the age of ninety -four.

To register or update your voter registration:

Use this website to submit an application online or to prefill and print a voter registration application form to sign and mail or deliver to your supervisor of elections. Voter registration application forms are also available for download if you do not wish to use this website.

To submit an online application, you will need:

- Your Florida driver license (Florida DL) or Florida identification card (Florida ID card)
- The issued date of your Florida DL or Florida ID card; and
- The last four digits of your Social Security Number (SSN4).

Note: If you do not have any of the information above, you may still use the online system to prefill a voter registration application form. However, you will have to print, sign, and then mail or deliver your completed voter registration application to your county Supervisor of Elections' office.

#### LOOKING FORWARD TO ANOTHER GREAT YEAR CELEBRATING OUR SCHOLARS

#### Scholarship Co-Chairs: Cheryl Tromley and Devera Graf

It is going to be a great year! We are so excited to get back to our new normal. Let me again thank everyone who donated during our difficult Covid time. Your generosity enabled us to fund all our scholarships. Those of you who were at the Scholarship Luncheon saw first-hand the difference your donations make in young women's lives. I know everyone is glad that we will have to do way less begging as we resume our in-person fund raising event!

I say "way less" rather than "not at all" because there is one scholarship that needs our help. The AAUW Star Bright Memorial Scholarship was established in 2005 by Book Club 3. It provides branch members with the opportunity to make donations honoring friends and commemorating special events. As funds accrue, a \$1,000scholarship is awarded to a female student attending the second semester at Fort Myers or Cape Coral Technical College. We have been able to award this scholarship every year since it was established, but this year is uncertain. We currently have only \$235.00 in the fund. So, if there is someone that you would like to honor or commemorate, or an important event you want memorialize, or just because you think it is a good idea, please think about adding to the fund. We will keep you up to date on our progress.

In a slightly different vein, I want to bring to your attention a possible issue involving the AAUW FSW State College Endowed Scholarship.

This scholarship was established in 2000, with member and matching funds from the state. It awards one \$1,000 scholarship to a female Lee County student with financial need attending the Fort Myers Campus of FSW. Priority is given to the current awardee. At least that is what it has been historically. Unfortunately, the Florida Department of Education had decreed that University managed endowed scholarships can no longer specify gender. We were required to sign a new Memo of Understanding reflecting this change. FSW understands and strongly supports our mission. In addition, the majority of FSW students are female. Therefore, the Board is hopeful, but not certain, that this will not turn out to be a problem. There are limited alternatives. Doing it ourselves, both the identification and selection of the scholars as well as the management of the fund, is not an option, unless there is someone who would like to take it on. The other option would be to put it into a community foundation. The problem with this is that the costs of the management would increase significantly. So, with no good options, we decided to wait and see. We will keep you updated on any developments.

We are looking forward to seeing everyone at our next meeting!!

We want to give a special thanks to the anonymous donor who covered the entire cost of our Scholars' luncheon and spurred even more generosity among our members. A huge THANK YOU to all of you who contributed at the luncheon and a special "shout out" to several of our members who were especially "spurred on" to make major contributions: Carol Fuechsel, Mary Lou Chamberlain, Tamara Pigott, Janet George, Laura Frost and Bonnie Ryan.

#### **Our Scholarships**

AAUW Star Bright Scholarship: This scholarship was established in 2005, by Book Club 3, to provide branch members with the opportunity to make donations honoring friends and commemorating special events. As funds accrue, a \$1,000 scholarship is awarded to a female student attending the second semester at Fort Myers or Cape Coral Technical College.

AAUW Lee County High School Scholarship: Established in 2011 in memory of Jane Wagner, a three-term branch president. It awards one \$1,000 scholarship per year to a graduating female student with financial need chosen by the school counselor. The award is paid to the college of the recipient's choice.

AAUW STEM Award: Established in 2001 to encourage middle and high school girls in STEM fields. It awards one \$500 prize to a top female entrant in the Thomas Alva Edison & Kiwanis Regional Science and Engineering Fair. A "First Time" award of \$100 is also given to a female entrant for an outstanding first entry. All Lee County female high school entrants in the Edison Regional Science Fair are eligible.

Marie Glasgow and AAUW STEM Award Fund: Established in 2019 in honor of Marie

Glasgow, president of AAUW Fort Myers/Lee Co Branch for two years. It is awarded each year with the goal of improving educational opportunities by rewarding young Middle School girl(s) who are winners at the Junior Division of Edison-Kiwanis Science Fair or Thomas Edison Festival of Light Regional Inventors Fair.

Girls in Engineering, Math and Science (GEMS): This hands-on program is dedicated to science education for regional middle school girls by enthusiastic professionals and undergraduates as facilitators and role models in a girls-only environment.

AAUW FGCU Endowed Scholarship: Established in 2000, with member and matching funds from the state, it awards one scholarship to a female student who resides in the five-county (Lee, Collier, Charlotte, Glades, Hendry) area with financial need pursuing an undergraduate degree at FGCU. Priority is given to the current awardee.

AAUW Sue Gottcent Memorial Endowed Scholarship: Established in 2006 with a bequest from the estate of member Sue Gottcent who was an avid supporter of AAUW's mission. It awards one \$2,000 scholarship to a Lee County female student aged 25 or older with demonstrated financial need who attends an institute of higher education that is part of the Florida State University system. Priority us given to the current awardee.

AAUW FSW State College Endowed Scholarship: Established in 2000, with member and matching funds from the state, it awards one \$1,000 scholarship to a female Lee County student with financial need attending the Fort Myers Campus of FSW. Priority is given to the current awardee
