## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greeting Members,

December can be a hectic month: Holiday parties, gift-giving, over-eating, contending with increased traffic. Amid all of this, we want to offer you some relaxing fun and a way to help support our scholarship fund. On December 14 we will be holding a bingo fundraiser.

This fundraiser is one of the primary ways we support our scholarship commitments. Yes, paying \$75.00 per person for a dinner buffet and bingo can seem like a lot of money---but when you consider the enjoyment of being with friends, the fun of playing bingo, the silent auction and the contribution you are making to the education of young women---what could be better?

Fundraising is an integral part of what we do. Funding scholarships and supporting students requires money. I know that our membership fee of \$99.00 seems like a lot but consider for a moment that our branch receives just \$15.00 from that amount.\* Twelve dollars times each of you does not result in much money to conduct all our activities! A similar calculation occurs when we consider the luncheons. Each luncheon costs \$27.00; we charge \$30.00. This gives us a profit of \$3.00 per person. If thirty people attend, we raise \$90.00. This amount also helps pay the speaker's fee, and often a pays for their spouse or a guest we have invited to honor. Every dollar is important, but not many scholarships will be funded with this amount of money!

This is a bit of a long-winded way of saying please join us---we can't continue our efforts on the behalf of women without your support.

Devera and I have the best job in our AAUW Lee County branch!! We are the ones who have the privilege of having the most direct contact with our scholars and can most closely observe the difference we make in their lives. This is particularly true of our *High School Scholarship* winners. We go visit their high schools, have the pleasure of meeting their counselors, and, most wonderfully, give our scholars the happy news.

The *AAUW Lee County High School Scholarship* awards two \$1,000 scholarships per year to a graduating female student who is highly motivated, high achieving, and with financial need. The scholarship rotates among all the high schools in Lee County. The young women do not apply for the scholarships but are chosen by their school counselors and advisors, so winning is a complete surprise to them.

In 2023 one of the winners was

Sophia Perez from North Fort Myers High School.

Let me tell you about the day we first met Sophia. Devera and I drove to North Fort Myers High School and, after getting a bit lost and being helped by a very friendly security guard, were able to park right at the entrance to the school. They had been expecting us and we were treated as honored guests. When we walked in the door we were greeted by Sophia's advisor and ushered to her guidance counselor's office. Sophia was called out of class and the four of us



awaited her arrival. While we waited, her advisor and counselor told us more about what a wonderful and deserving young woman she was. Sophia walked in with some trepidation. What high school student wants to be called out of her class to see her advisor??? Something had to be wrong!! She sat down slowly, and we then told her about her scholarship. She was astonished, and her mouth literally dropped open. We explained that she had been chosen by her advisor and counselor from among all the girls in her senior class as the one they thought was most deserving and most likely to succeed. She said disbelievingly, at least twice, "I was the only one?" Devera and I both teared up and spent the drive home talking about how wonderful and important the work that we all do **together** is. **Let's be clear, we could not do any of this without your continuous and generous support. THANK YOU!!!!**

Just an update, Devera has been in touch with Sophia, and she is now successfully attending classes at the University of Miami. She reports that all is going well and that the scholarship money she received has helped immensely with college expenses. She is very thankful for the help she received from AAUW.

Please help us keep this important work going. Come to the Bingo Gala on December 14. Get a table and bring your friends. If you do get a table, everyone at the table will get an extra bingo card!! Remember that this is an "all welcome" event, so grab all your friends, family, mates, etc. If your male friends and mates are worried about there not being any men, you can assure them that that will **not** be the case. I have over 8 men at my two tables, and that is just my tables. Your President Cecile and I (Cheryl) will again be the Bingo callers, and we need your smiling faces out there!

This is our major fundraiser and without your generous support I will have to go back to begging for funds again....If you aren't sure about participating, remember Sophia and the

other wonderful young women you met last spring who were so moving in their appreciation. **We really do change lives, and not everyone can say that!**

### ***AAUW Star Bright Scholarship***

The AAUW Star Bright Memorial Scholarship was established in 2005 by Book Club 3. It provides branch members with the opportunity to make donations honoring friends and commemorating special events. As funds accrue, a \$1,000 scholarship is awarded to a female student attending the second semester at Fort Myers or Cape Coral Technical College.

### ***AAUW Lee County High School Scholarship:***

Established in 2011 in memory of Jane Wagner, a three-term branch president. It awards one \$1,000 scholarship per year to a graduating female student with financial need chosen by the school counselor. The award is paid to the college of the recipient's choice.

***AAUW STEM Awards:*** Established in 2001 to encourage middle and high school girls in STEM fields. It awards two \$300 prizes based on those projects submitted to the Thomas Alva Edison & Kiwanis Regional Science and Engineering Fair: The AAUW Thomas Edison and Kiwanis Regional Science & Engineering Fair Award goes to a top female entrant; The AAUW Thomas Edison and Kiwanis Regional Science & Engineering Fair Emerging Research Scholar Award goes to a female entrant whose skills are laudable, but still developing.

***Marie Glasgow and AAUW STEM Award Fund:*** Established in 2019 in honor of Marie Glasgow, president of AAUW Fort Myers/Lee Co Branch for two years. It is awarded each year with the goal of improving educational opportunities by rewarding young Middle

Thomas Edison Festival of Light Regional Inventors Fair.

***Girls in Engineering, Math and Science (GEMS):*** This hands-on program is dedicated to science education for regional middle school girls by enthusiastic professionals and undergraduates as facilitators and role models in a girls-only environment.

### ***AAUW FGCU Endowed Scholarship:***

Established in 2000, with member and matching funds from the state, it awards one scholarship to a female student who resides in the five-county (Lee, Collier, Charlotte, Glades, Hendry) area with financial need pursuing an undergraduate degree at FGCU. Priority is given to the current awardee.

***AAUW Sue Gottcent Memorial Endowed Scholarship:*** Established in 2006 with a bequest from the estate of member Sue Gottcent who was an avid supporter of AAUW's mission. It awards one \$2,000 scholarship to a Lee County female student aged 25 or older with demonstrated financial need who attends an institute of higher education that is part of the Florida State University system. Priority is given to the current awardee.

### ***AAUW FSW State College Endowed Scholarship:***

Established in 2000, with member and matching funds from the state, it awards one \$1,000 scholarship to a female Lee County student with financial need attending the Fort Myers Campus of FSW. Priority is given to the current awardee.
