Our AAUW Board has approved an exciting new opportunity for our members to support our scholarships. Beginning in 2024/2025 fiscal year, anyone will be able to sponsor and name a scholarship "in honor of" someone.

Alice Paul

A vocal leader of the twentieth century women's suffrage movement, Alice Paul advocated for and helped secure passage of the 19th Amendment to the US Constitution, granting women the right to vote. Paul next authored the Equal Rights Amendment in 1923, which seeks to end the legal distinctions between men and women in terms of divorce, property, employment, and other matters, which has yet to be adopted. From its establishment in 1881, when a small group of female college graduates got together to work for women's career advancement and to encourage more women to pursue higher education, AAUW has expanded its mission to include a wide range of issues women face as life gets more complicated and America becomes more diverse. SUPPORTING OUR SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarship Co-Chairs: Cheryl Tromley and Devera Graf

Often when we come to you about supporting our scholarships, we are begging you for donations. Not so this time, when we want to **THANK YOU** for your incredible generosity. Because of that generosity, this coming year, we can increase our support for a number of our established scholarships and fund some exciting additions to our STEM awards. This is something we have always dreamed of being able to do and we cannot thank you enough, on behalf of the young women whose aspirations and dreams you are supporting.

AAUW**FGCU** and **FSW** Endowed Scholarships: These scholarships were established in 2000. They award scholarships to female students who reside in the five-county (Lee, Collier, Charlotte, Glades, Hendry) area, with financial need, pursuing undergraduate degrees at FGCU and FSW respectively. The amount awarded is a percentage of the endowments and is approximately \$2,000.

AAUW Star Bright Scholarships: Originally established in 2005, by Book Club 3, to provide branch members with the opportunity to make donations honoring friends and commemorating special events. There are now two Star Bright Scholarships, and they are a budgeted item that awards scholarships to female students attending the second semester at Cape Coral Technical College and Fort Myers Technical College.

We were able to increase the funding of these life-changing scholarships to \$2,000 each.

AAUW Lee County High School Scholarships: Established in 2011 in memory of Jane Wagner, a three-term branch president. Two scholarships are awarded to graduating female students (from two different schools) with financial need. The scholars are chosen by the schools' counselors and the scholarships are paid to the colleges of the recipients' choice. We were able to raise these awards to \$2,000 each.

AAUW STEM Awards (High-School): Established in 2001 to encourage high school girls in STEM fields, it awards two entrants in the Thomas Alva Edison & Kiwanis Regional Science and Engineering Fair. Recipients must present a unique, quality topic, and conduct their own research. Judging is done by members of the Scholarship Committee. The AAUW Thomas Edison and Kiwanis Regional Science & Engineering Fair Award and Emerging Research Scholar Award will now each provide a \$500 prize.

AAUW STEM Awards (Middle-School): Many of you know that girls often lose interest in STEM in middle-school, so this is an important time to support that interest. As you know we contribute annually to Girls in Engineering, Math, and Science (GEMS) program. Past **Torch** articles have highlighted this hands-on program dedicated to science education for regional middle-school students. The day-long programs, in a girls-only environment, are presented by enthusiastic professionals with undergraduates participating as facilitators and role models. This year we are able to increase the amount of our contribution to \$1,500. In addition, for this year, we are going to be able to support young women's interest in STEM by providing awards to middle-school girls participating in the Junior Division of Thomas Edison Festival of Light Regional Inventors Fair. There will be three Regional Inventors Fair. There will be three \$200 awards—one each in grades six, seven and eight.



Our two remaining scholarships will be funded at their budgeted levels:

AAUW Sue Gottcent Memorial Endowed Scholarship: Established in 2006 with a bequest from the estate of member Sue Gottcent, who was an avid supporter of AAUW's mission. It awards one \$2,000 scholarship to a Lee County female student, age 25 or older with demonstrated financial need who attends an institute of higher education that is part of the Florida State University system. Priority is given to the current awardee.

Marie Glasgow and AAUW Friends STEM Award Fund: Established in 2019 in honor of Marie Glasgow, president of AAUW Fort Myers/Lee Co. Branch for two terms. \$500 is awarded each year with the goal of improving educational opportunities by rewarding young Middle School girl(s) who are winners at the Junior Division of Edison-Kiwanis Science

Fair or Thomas Edison Festival of Light Regional Inventors Fair. In even numbered years the award will go to a Lee County Middle School (grades 6-8) girl participating in the Junior Division of the Edison-Kiwanis **Regional Science Fair**.

The winner should demonstrate meritorious effort but is **not a major winner** (i.e., third or fourth place.) The project must be STEM related and show proof of own research. In odd numbered years the award will go to a Lee County Middle School (grades 6-8) girl participating in the Thomas Edison Festival of Light Regional Inventor's Fair. The winner should show meritorious effort but is not a major winner (i.e., third or fourth place.). The projects could benefit Mankind or the Environment. Judging for both awards is done by the Special Award Staff. The Award Judges may suggest different selection criteria but must seek approval of donor prior to award disbursement.

Looking ahead to 2025

Great Decisions is sponsored by the Foreign Policy Association (www.fpa.org). FPA was founded in 1918 as the League of Free Nations Association to achieve a just peace. It was reconstituted in 1923 as the Foreign Policy Association, committing to the careful study of all sides of international questions affecting the U.S. John Foster Dulles and Eleanor Roosevelt were among its incorporators. Great Decisions came about in 1954. Since then, it has become the largest nonpartisan public education program on international affairs in the world. Participants are given an opportunity to complete surveys on each of the discussion topics. Those results are shared with the White House, the Departments of State and Defense, members of Congress, and the nation's media.

FPA chooses eight topics each year. We meet the first Friday of every month (rescheduled if it conflicts with a holiday) at 12:30 p.m. via Zoom, February through June and September through November. Each member purchases a book (approx. \$35) with essays for each topic, written by an expert on that topic. In addition, a video, called a Master Class, is prepared for each topic. The Master Class is not a restatement of the information in the book but rather an enhancement of the material that was presented. The 2025 topics are:

American Foreign Policy at a Crossroads
U.S. Changing Leadership of the World Economy
U.S.-China Relations
International Cooperation on Climate Change
The Future of NATO and European Security
AI and American National Security
India: Between China, the West, and the Global South
After Gaza: American Policy in the Middle East

If you are interested in more information, contact Suzan Harden. Books ordered by the end of October can be purchased for a 20% discount if a minimum of 10 books is ordered. A reminder will be published in the October Torch. Also, if you would like to participate in Great Decisions but would prefer an in-person meeting, let Suzan know. Upcoming Elections

Tuesday, November 5 – General Election Deadline to Register – October 7 Deadline to Request that Ballot be Mailed – October 24

If you have updated your request that your ballot be mailed since Dec. 31, 2022, your request is valid until the end of this year. You do not need to do it again.

Vote-by-Mail Ballots will not be forwarded by the U.S. Postal Service. If you need your ballot forwarded to a different address than that on your voter registration record, you must contact the Supervisor of Elections.

If your signature has changed considerably (illness, accident), contact the Supervisor of Elections to get your new signature on record.

To assure timely delivery, the Supervisor of Elections recommends you mail your Vote-by-Mail ballot 10 days prior to the election. The mail ballot must reach the elections office by 7 p.m. November 5.

NOVEMBER 2024 ELECTIONS

In addition to the election of candidates, Florida voters will also be considering six amendments to the Florida Constitution. The text for each amendment is given as it will appear on the ballot.

Amendment 1 – Partisan School Board Members

Partisan Election of Members of District School Boards - Proposing amendments to the State Constitution to require members of a district school board to be elected in a partisan election rather than a nonpartisan election and to specify that the amendment only applies to elections held on or after the November 2026 general election. However, partisan primary elections may occur before the 2026 general election for purposes of nominating political party candidates to that office for placement on the 2026 general election ballot.

Amendment 2 – Right to Fish and Hunt

Right to Fish and Hunt - Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to preserve forever fishing and hunting, including by the use of traditional methods, as a public right and preferred means of responsibly managing and controlling fish and wildlife. Specifies that the amendment does not limit the authority granted to the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission under Section 9 of Article IV of the State Constitution.

<u>Amendment 3 – Adult Personal Use of Marijuana</u>

Adult Personal Use of Marijuana - Allows adults 21 years or older to possess, purchase, or use marijuana products and marijuana accessories for non-medical personal consumption by smoking, ingestion, or otherwise; allows Medica Marijuana Treatment Centers, and other state licensed entities, to acquire, cultivate, process, manufacture, sell, and distribute such products and accessories. Applies to Florida law; does not change, or immunize violations of, federal law. Establishes possession limits for personal use. Allows consistent legislation. Defines terms. Provides effective date.

Amendment 4 – Abortion Access

Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion: No law shall prohibit, penalize, delay, or restrict abortion before viability or when necessary to protect the patient's health, as determined by the patient's healthcare provider. This amendment does not change the Legislature's constitutional authority to require notification to a parent or guardian before a minor has an abortion.

Amendment 5 – Homestead Annual Inflation Adjustment

Annual adjustment to Homestead Exemption Value: Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to require an annual adjustment for inflation to the value of current or future homestead exemptions that apply solely to levies other than school district levies and for which every person who has legal or equitable title to real estate and maintains thereon the permanent residence of the owner, or another person legally or naturally dependent upon the owner is eligible. This amendment takes effect January 1, 2025.

Amendment 6 – Repeal of Public Campaign Financing Requirement

Repeal of Public Campaign Financing Requirement: Proposing the repeal of the provision in the State Constitution which requires public financing for campaigns of candidates for elective statewide office who agree to campaign spending limits.


