

October Woman of Interest

Edith Wilson *October* 15, 1872 – December 28, 1961) was as the second wife of President Woodrow Wilson. She married the widower Wilson in December 1915, during his first term as president. Edith Wilson played an influential role in President Wilson's administration following the severe stroke he suffered in October 1919. For the remainder of her husband's presidency, she managed the office of the p resident, a role she later described as a "stewardship", and determined which communications and matters of state were important enough to bring to the attention of the bedridden president.

Our AAUW Board has approved an exciting new opportunity for our members to support our scholarships. Beginning in 2024/2025 fiscal year, anyone will be able to sponsor and name a scholarship "in honor of" someone.

For example, Cheryl Tromley intends to fund the Fort Myers Technical College Star Bright Scholarship and name it "The Violet Roberts FMTC Star Bright Scholarship" in honor of her grandmother. You can do this as an individual or partner with others.

This offer would apply to the following scholarships:

- o AAUW Star Bright Scholarship (Cape Coral Technical College): \$1,000 per year.
- o AAUW Lee County High School Scholarships: 2 @ \$1,500 per year.
- o AAUW Thomas Edison and Kiwanis Regional Science & Engineering Fair Award: \$300 per year.
- o AAUW Thomas Edison and Kiwanis Regional Science & Engineering Fair Emerging Research Scholar Award: \$300 per year.

This opportunity does not change any of our normal donation processes. All opportunities for donating will remain the same, and this is just an *additional way* to contribute to our scholarships and an *additional way* to honor someone. The normal channels will still be available.

In addition, if anyone wants to donate "in honor of..." but does not want to commit to a sponsorship, as has always been the case, they may elect to target that donation to a specific scholarship or the scholarship fund. If the latter, the Scholarship Committee and/or Chairs will allocate it where the need is greatest.

AAUW Star Bright Scholarships: Established in 2005, by Book Club 3, to provide branch members with the opportunity to make donations honoring friends and commemorating special events, this scholarship awards two \$2,000 scholarships to female students attending their second semesters at Cape Coral Technical College and Fort Myers Technical College. The latter is a sponsored scholarship, the "AAUW Violet Roberts Star Bright Scholarship."

AAUW Lee County High School Scholarship: Established in 2011 in memory of Jane Wagner, a three-term branch president. It awards two \$2,000 scholarships per year to graduating female students with financial need chosen by the school counselor. The award is paid to the college of the recipient's choice.

AAUW STEM Awards:

Established in 2001 to encourage high school girls in STEM fields, it awards two entrants in the Thomas Alva Edison & Kiwanis Regional Science and Engineering Fair. Recipients must present a unique, quality topic, and conduct their own research. Judging is done by members of the Scholarship Committee. The first award, the AAUW Thomas Edison and Kiwanis Regional Science & Engineering Fair Award, provides a \$500 prize to a promising female entrant. The second award, the AAUW Thomas Edison and Kiwanis Regional Science & Engineering Fair Emerging Research Scholar Award, provides a \$500 prize to a female entrant for a project that shows promise with the goal of encouraging her participation in future years. Established in 2025 to encourage middle school girls in STEM fields, this scholarship awards \$200 to three entrants (one each in grades six, seven, and eight) in the Junior Division of the Thomas Edison Festival of Light Regional Inventors Fair.

Our Scholarships

Marie Glasgow and AAUW Friends STEM Award Fund: Established in 2019 in honor of Marie Glasgow, president of AAUW Fort Myers/Lee Co. branch for two terms, it is awarded each year with the goal of improving educational opportunities by rewarding young Middle School girl(s) who are winners at the Junior Division of Edison-Kiwanis Science Fair or Thomas Edison Festival of Light Regional Inventors Fair. In even numbered years the award will go to a Lee County Middle School girl (grades 6-8) participating in the Junior Division of the Edison-Kiwanis Regional Science Fair. The winner should demonstrate meritorious effort

AAUW FGCU Endowed Scholarship: Established in 2000, it awards one (approximately) \$2,000 scholarship to a female student who resides in the five-county (Lee, Collier, Charlotte, Glades, Hendry) area, with financial need, pursuing an undergraduate degree at FGCU. Priority is given to the current awardee.

AAUW Sue Gottcent Memorial Endowed Scholarship: Established in 2006 with a bequest from the estate of member Sue Gottcent, who was an avid supporter of AAUW's mission. It awards one \$2,000 scholarship to a Lee County female student aged 25 or older, with demonstrated financial need, who attends an institute of higher education that is part of the Florida State University system. Priority us given to the current awardee.

AAUW FSW State College Endowed Scholarship: Established in 2000, it awards one (approximately) \$1,000 scholarship to a female Lee County student with financial need attending the Fort Myers Campus of FSW. Priority is given to the current awardee.

CELEBRATING GEMS

Scholarship Co-Chairs: Cheryl Tromley and Devera Graf

Many of you are familiar with GEMS (Girls in Engineering, Math, and Science), one of our STEM scholarships. It was developed as a handson science education program for regional middle school girls and held at the Whitaker Center on the FGCU campus. One of its unique features is that, while it is led by professionals, undergraduates serve as facilitators and role-models. Unfortunately, due to anti-DEI initiatives, the program has had to be renamed Growing in Engineering, Math, and Science as it must be open to both genders. This is a problem across the nation for all single-gender scholarships that are administered by Universities and other organizations that receive any federal funding. It is a particular challenge for an organization like the AAUW. Our Board continues to explore strategies for managing this issue within the spirit of our mission of empowering women and girls through our scholarships.

The first GEMS program of this academic year was held on Saturday, September 27. The students were split into two groups, had the opportunity to explore two areas of study, and go home with two "hands-on" projects. Two instructors led the process in adjoining rooms. After the first session finished, the students switched rooms and worked on the other topic.

The first topic was learning about pH. In this session, participants tested several solutions with known pH values. These solutions are called "buffers." They then looked at different household liquids to see at what pH turmeric will turn red. Later, the students were able to create pictures using the pH colors they created.

The second session explored the textures of different kinds of soils, specifically sand, silt and clay. The students discussed why pH

matters in our lives. They discovered that the texture of a soil impacts water drainage, root growth, nutrient growing, and soil erosion. Through this discussion, they developed a deeper understanding of the importance of soil as the foundation for all land life through supporting our buildings, growing our foods, etc. The participants then collected soil samples outside, added water to them in a petri dishes, and determined if they were sand, silt, or clay. Later, the students had a chance to paint a picture using paints made from the different soils. What a great day for this group of Middle School students, learning scientific concepts in a fun way! Thank you for helping to make this possible!!!!!









